IDOLS

xodus 20:4-6 says, "You shall not make for yourself an idol in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I,

the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing love to a thousand [generations] of those who love me and keep my commandments."

Growing up as someone who accepted Jesus as my savior at an early age and believed the Biblical worldview, I never truly understood the concept of idols- I mean we have a real God who loves us and want to have a relationship

with us so worship a pile of rocks or stone statue on my first trip to Israel when I was 21 years old we spent the night in the Sinai desert. One night we camped right on the Israeli Egyptian border. Although deserts are supposed to be hot that night was the coldest night of my life. Literally, the coldest night I can ever remember! I felt like I laid for hours waiting for the sun to come up. When the sun did finally come up, I did NOT worship it that morning, but I had an understanding of why ancient cultures and to some degree cultures today worship the sun. It gave me something that I desperately needed at that time –WARMTH! Sadly, it is all too easy to worship something based on our perceived immediate needs.

Dictionary.com defines "Idol" as "an image or representation of a god used as an object of worship." My online search of the word "idol" mostly revealed a lot of information about an American Idol style "reality televi-

sion" show that exists in many countries in the world. The sad truth is that we are always looking for something (sometimes it seems like anything) to idolize. Yet the Bible is quite clear- "Worship the Lord your God and serve only Him."

When we exchange the worship of God for anything else we make a very, very poor trade. As Paul writes in Romans 1:21-23, "For although they knew God, they neither glorified him as God nor gave thanks to him, but their thinking became futile, and their foolish hearts were darkened. Although they

claimed to be wise, they became fools and exchanged the glory of the immortal God for images made to look like mortal man and birds and animals and reptiles."

KENDRICK BROTHERS RELEASE "SHOW ME THE FATHER" ON SEPTEMBER 10 Submitted by Pastor Frank

he upcoming documentary "Show Me the Father" created by the Kendrick Brothers will be released on September 10. The Sony Pictures' Affirm Films flick will explore in detail the fatherhood of God. "Everyone has a father story, but not everyone has learned how to redeem it for their own good and the good of others," Stephen Kendrick said of the film. "Even though fatherlessness is directly connected to so much brokenness in today's world, we wanted to go beyond traditional documentaries and show how God is the perfect Father and can amazingly provide the love and healing to anyone at any stage in life." In an interview with The Christian Post at the National Religious Broadcasters convention in Grapevine, Texas, in June, Kendrick revealed that "Show Me The Father" was birthed in prayer, "God said, 'You need to make this documentary about fatherhood.' So we moved forward by faith, and we were able to connect with some of the coolest, most emotional stories about fatherhood. We took some of the most powerful truths about the fatherhood of God, put it all together and prayed over it," he said. "We want people to learn how to relate to God as the perfect Father they've always wanted and longed for, but never had," he added. "The fatherhood of God was the design for God creating fatherhood on Earth. All the roles that dad is supposed to play on Earth come from God's roles in our lives." Kendrick said he and his brothers were greatly impacted by their own father's commitment to Christ. "I didn't stumble upon my dad looking at pornography growing up. I stumbled upon him on his knees in prayer, crying out to God," Kendrick testified. "I saw his faithfulness to my mom because of what Jesus had done in his life. I saw him keeping his promises. He never lied to me. His legacy



is what transformed our family." "Show Me The Father" will feature an original score and include insights from bestselling author and Pastor Tony Evans. The film features a father's blessing as an example for men to emulate in their own families. "We show how a father's blessing is modeled in Scripture, and Tony Evans talks about how he gives men at his church a father's blessing. It's an emotional part of the story because everyone longs for that," he told CP. Despite focusing on fatherhood, the "Fireproof" filmmaker said the upcoming film, "Show Me The Father" is for everyone and will impact each viewer differently.

FROM THE **BOOKSHELF**



FOCUS ON AFGHANISTAN: HOW TO PRAY FOR AFGHANISTAN TODAY

fghan members of our Christian family treasure our prayers during this time of upheaval and violence. Here are some specific ways you can pray for them:

- 1. PRAY FOR GOD'S PROTECTION. The situation on the ground is fluid right now. Pray for God's protection over His people.
- PRAY FOR WISDOM. Ask God to bless our brothers and sisters with discernment as they decide whether to stay or go and even with whom they should talk.
- 3. PRAY FOR FELLOWSHIP. Believers in Afghanistan often must keep their faith a secret — even from family members. Pray that God will help each Afghan believer to connect and fellowship with at least one other believer in person, by phone or through some other technology. Pray that God will remind them that they are not alone, but are part of the global body of Christ.
- PRAY FOR SAFE PASSAGE. Pray that God will provide safe passage to those who feel led by God to leave Afghanistan and provide for their immediate needs in their new location.
- 5. PRAY THAT MUSLIMS WILL MEET CHRIST. The Taliban claim to be "true Muslims," strictly adhering to Sharia (Islamic law). As Muslims in Afghanistan see this cruel face of Islam, pray that they will be drawn to Jesus Christ, the shepherd Savior who doesn't oppress but instead chose to lay down His life for His sheep.
- PRAY FOR CHRISTIANS TRYING TO HELP. For decades, VOM has
 provided help and encouragement to Christians in Afghanistan.
 Pray for the wisdom of front-line workers and pray that God will
 open new pathways for them to continue their work under Taliban control.



60% OF U.S. ADULTS UNDER 40 SAY JESUS ISN'T THE ONLY WAY TO SALVATION; EQUAL TO BUDDHA, MUHAMMAD

ore than 60% of born again Christians in America between the ages of 18 and 39 believe that Buddha, Muhammad and Jesus are all valid paths to salvation and over 30% say they either believe that Jesus sinned just like other people when He lived on Earth or aren't sure, according to



a new study. There's a "striking decline" in evangelical religious beliefs and practices over the last 10 years, as

the number of self-proclaimed believers to hold these beliefs has increased by nearly 25%, says Probe Ministries in a statement announcing the results of its Religious Views & Practices Survey. The study, which interviewed 3,100 Americans ages 18 to 55 in 2020 and looked at various other previ-

ous studies, saw a drop in "basic biblical worldview" - God's attributes, the accuracy of the Bible, salvation and Jesus being sinless — from 47% in 2010 to 25% in 2020 among born again Christians. The drop in the "expanded biblical worldview" — beliefs about Satan and morals being objective — went from 32% in 2010 to 16% in 2020. "So, the percentage of Born Again Christians with a biblical worldview (of either type) has been cut in half over the last decade," says the study, which compared the 18-29 age group from 2010 with the same age group 10 years later, now 30-39. "This result is a startling degradation in worldview beliefs of Born-Again Christians over just 10 years. "This means, even born-again Christians "can have a false view of Jesus Christ and embrace a pluralistic worldview," Kerby Anderson, president of Probe Ministries, said. "Pastors and church leaders just can't assume any longer that the members of their church or Christian organization have a biblical worldview."
